Thank you for submitting a revised Project Notification Form (PNF) for the project referenced above, which was received at this office on February 10, 2020. The staff of the Massachusetts Historical Commission (MHC) have reviewed the information submitted and have the following comments.

The proposed project consists of either the renovation of the existing Florence Roche Elementary School at 342 Main Street in Groton, or the demolition of the existing school and construction of a new school building at the same location. The information provided indicates that the project will use funding from the Massachusetts School Building Authority (MSBA).

Review of MHC's files indicates that the existing Florence Roche Elementary School is neither included in MHC's Inventory of Historic and Archaeological Assets of the Commonwealth, nor listed in the National and State Registers of Historic Places. No further review by the MHC is required for the MSBA-funded project.
